Security and Society in the Information Age investigates global topics from the unique perspective of Central and Eastern Europe. SRAS and Collegium Civitas partner to offer academically focused study abroad and create innovative faculty-led programs and symposia. Warsaw, one of Europe's most dynamic cities, provides a rich historical and cultural base for exploration.

Security and Society Summer School (Courses)

Security Issues and Central Europe

Start with a broad overview of the challenges faced by the countries of Central Europe, NATO, and the European Union. Conflicts with Russia will be discussed while examining the complex historical roots of these conflicts. We will discuss intelligence, hybrid war, cybersecurity, resource security, and the role that traditional and new media play in state security.

CEE: The Road to Democracy

Follow the history of the transition from communism to democracy in Central and Eastern Europe. We will study the political, economic, and social factors leading to the development of the Polish Solidarity (SOLIDARNO[]Ć) movement, the Czech Velvet Revolution, the violent revolution in Romania, the fall of the Berlin Wall, and the collapse of the Soviet Union.

Terrorism and Hybrid Warfare

Explore the range of issues related to international terrorism and the challenges posed by hybrid warfare. We look at tools and methods of combating those phenomena, as well as on their impact on the functioning of the state and its citizens, both in the public and private sectors. We will discuss the evolution of modern terrorism, psychology of terrorism, risk assessment and analysis, and issues related to mass media.

Genocide: From Radicalization to the Unthinkable

The course provides participants with the intellectual framework for understanding the numerous, complex and often emotional issues related to genocide. We will examine several historical and current major cases of genocide, providing the foundation for comparative analysis and exploration of selected broad themes.

Project 2020: Technology and Society

Explore the thin line between reality and fiction in literature, film, and gaming. We will look at science fiction from the perspectives of sociology, security, and political science. We will consider science fiction as a predictor - and ponder upon futurology and foresight. Alongside a series of, discussions, and workshops, we will be working on essays for publication in a course anthology.

Research Internship: Terrorism Research Center

Founded in 2006, the Terrorism Research Center is a research unit within Collegium Civitas and is one of the leading think-tanks in Poland. While working on your own supervised research project, you will conduct research and analysis, interview experts, attend events and meetings organized by TRC, and contribute, along with other interns and experts, a research paper for publication.

Each course is 6 ECTS (3 US semester credits).
